We put out a message that if anyone needed sand and stone we have lots available. The up shot of that was that we have had two trucks and a digger loader for over a week carting away sand and stone to help rebuild some of the farm roads. This has helped us to clear up some of the mess as well as trying to give the river a more defined course.



We are thankful that despite the water going through the pumphouse and submerging the newly installed pump in the process, the pump is operational.

Initially to get to the other side of the river we repaired the boat that was in the shed. Now we can wade across the bridge at the weir, which is still intact, though only a section is visible. The rest is somewhere under a mound



of sand, while a third section is still under water. The bridge at the Grotto floated away again and came to rest at the pump house along with the No Swimming sign from the waterfall. As the water has subsided we were able to go on an expedition to the waterfall. See Mathilda's report on that.

We are also thankful that all the guests who booked for October arrived despite long delays at roadworks and driving the Karwyderskraal Road, which is gravel.

Thursday morning Chapel services have continued, even though they have mostly been attended by those resident on Volmoed. Two of our faithful visitors, not to be deterred arrived on foot on an occasion and by bicycle the next time. Continuing with our theme of Thanksgiving it was decided to have a special Thanksgiving service on Thursday morning the 2nd November, to which we have invited all our valley neighbours.
