Volmoed was established in 1986 during some of the darkest days of apartheid as a place that was open to all, seeking to pursue reconciliation amongst people divided by race and class, and witnessing to God's gift of healing and wholeness. Volmoed continues to pursue and embody its founding vision.

Visiting groups or individuals are free to arrange their own programs at Volmoed. But both the resident Anglican Benedictine monks and our Chaplain Wilma are available to assist or lead retreats

Volmoed has hosted various events over the years, like Art Workshops and Icon Writing courses to name a few.

The Volmoed Youth Leadership Program has been ongoing since 2016.

The annual Theological Colloquium, jointly sponsored with Stellenbosch University, will also host Dr Williams in November at Volmoed.


